# Archaeology Celebration at Vista del Rio Park! Saturday March 13, 2010 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. – FREE!

The Vista del Rio Residents' Association and Old Pueblo Archaeology Center proudly join hands to sponsor fun and educational activities in the Vista del Rio Cultural Resource Park in celebration of Arizona Archaeology and Heritage Awareness Month. This March 13 program is designed to educate children, especially ages 8 to 12, about the ancient Hohokam Indians who lived at the Vista del Rio archaeological site (which is located in this City of Tucson park) and elsewhere in southern Arizona.

Bring the kids to enjoy numerous cultural hands-on activities, including making pottery artifacts to take home, grinding corn using an ancient metate and mano, making stone and cordage jewelry, and learning to play traditional Native American games. There also will be demonstrations of traditional Native American crafts such as stone arrow-head making. The hands-on activities, demonstrations, and informational materials will be along the trails through the park where part of the ancient Hohokam Indian village is preserved.
