Arrowhead Making & Flintknapping Workshops

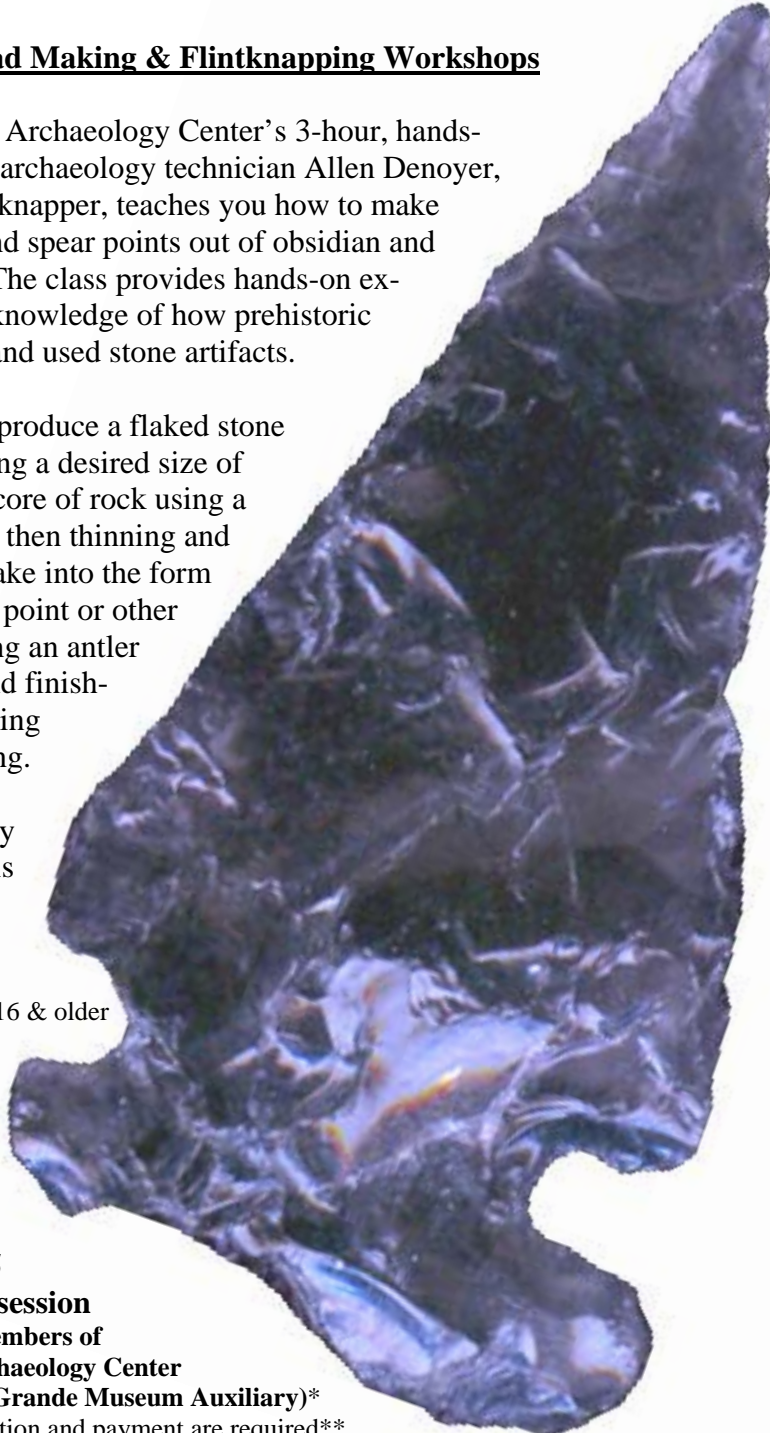
In Old Pueblo Archaeology Center's 3-hour, hands-on workshop, archaeology technician Allen Denoyer, an expert flintknapper, teaches you how to make arrowheads and spear points out of obsidian and other stones. The class provides hands-on experience and knowledge of how prehistoric people made and used stone artifacts.

Learn how to produce a flaked stone tool by breaking a desired size of flake off of a core of rock using a hammerstone, then thinning and shaping the flake into the form of a projectile point or other stone tool using an antler implement, and finishing the tool using pressure flaking.
