

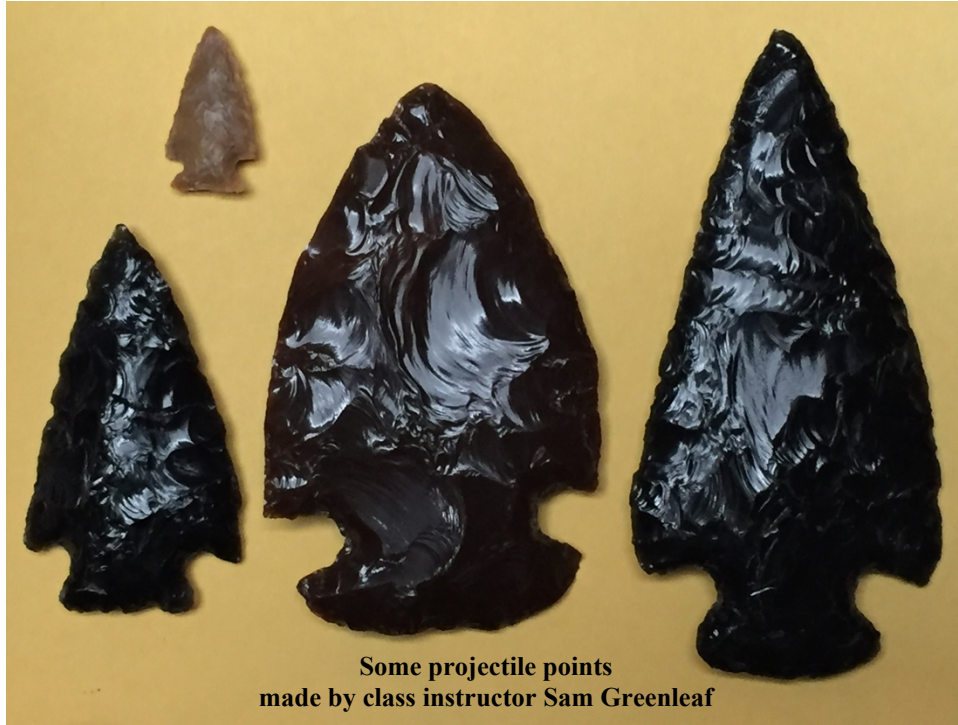


Old Pueblo Archaeology Center's Arrowhead Making & Flintknapping Workshop

In Old Pueblo Archaeology Center's three-hour workshop, expert flintknapper Sam Greenleaf demonstrates and teaches how to make arrowheads and spear points out of obsidian and other stones. He provides hands-on experience in making stone tools, and insights into how ancient peoples made and used stone artifacts.

This activity is designed to help modern people understand how early Native Americans made and used tools, and is not intended to train people how to make crafts for sale.

Register for the workshop to get hands-on instruction in how to produce a flaked stone tool by breaking a desired size of flake off of a core of rock using a hammer-stone, thinning and shaping the flake into a projectile point or other stone implement using an antler tool, and finishing the artifact using pressure flaking. All necessary equipment is provided.

Participation in the workshop is limited to persons age 16 and older unless a parent or guardian also enrolls. Maximum enrollment is 8 persons per class
