




Mapping Yaqui History

In her University of Arizona doctoral dissertation in history, *Mapping Yaqui Mobility:* Community, Identity, and Labor, 1770–1940, Anabel Galindo explores the Yaqui community, identity, and mobility from the late colonial to the early 20th century. Using mobility as a theoretical framework, she emphasizes the importance of moving away from misconstrued notions about Indigenous Peoples and their history.

In this presentation for Old Pueblo Archaeology Center's Indigenous Interests series, Dr. Galindo will focus on Yaqui history and how her dissertation work fits in the literature, and will discuss her work with the Pascua Yaqui Tribe of Arizona.

Currently she is a Mellon Postdoctoral Fellow at Arizona State University's Center for Imagination in the Borderlands, and she works for the Pascua Yaqui Tribe Department of Language and Culture as a history instructor, developing classes and curriculum for community members of all ages to engage in Yaqui history through a multidisciplinary approach.

Anabel is a proud mother of two beautiful daughters, and together they are learning the beautiful Yaqui language.
